# Anti-Bullying Week

11th—15th November 2019



PSHE lessons and assemblies have been based on the theme of “Change starts with us” this week to mark Anti-Bullying Week.

We have talked about the difference between being hurt by accident, falling out with a friend or someone saying or doing something unkind on one or two occasions and instances of bullying.

We teach children that bullying is:

- one-sided
- on purpose
- repeated
- hurtful

We take concerns about bullying seriously and work hard to encourage all members of our school community to be kind and respectful. If a child feels upset by someone else’s behaviour, we teach them to tell an adult who can help. If you have any concerns, please speak to your child’s class team, in the first instance.

I was very pleased that according to Parent questionnaires completed on parents evening, 84% parents felt that their children hadn’t experienced any bullying at Brewster Avenue. 13% of you agree that we deal with cases of bullying effectively and 4% have concerns about the way we have dealt with an incidence of bullying.
