2016-2017 Objectives

- To develop teachers knowledge, understanding and skills in the teaching and learning of PE
- To extend the opportunities the children have to enter into sporting competitions and events with other schools
- To provide good quality PE provision from a highly trained teacher for all the children to access
- To ensure that the PE lead develops key skills to promote PE and sports and raise the profile and quality of teaching and learning

2016-2017 Sport Premium Grant

- £3579 received in April 2016
- £5011 received in November 2016
- £8590 received in total

2016-2017 Spending

- Nene Park Academy Service Level Agreement £3600. This includes:
 - 1 afternoon weekly coach to come into school to support the teaching and learning of PE
 - 3 x training sessions for all teachers on teaching PE
 - 1 inter schools sports tournament / celebration sports event for each year group
 - 2 x enrichment/sports day sessions for the whole school across the academic year
- PE Resources £3893. This includes:
 - Buying of good quality resources for indoor and outdoor PE
 - Outdoor equipment updating
- Lunchtime equipment and outdoor learning £728
- Subject leader release time £392
- Total spending £8613

2016-2017 Impact

Staff Training/CPD:

- Higher skilled staff to enable high quality teaching to continue even if funding stops.
- Confidence to carry out own sports clubs after school, which has provided more children with the opportunity to join a club.
- Higher quality lessons being taught so children progress well in PE.
- Children enjoying PE and sports more, as a wide range of activities are being taught.
- Lessons meet the needs of a range of abilities and interests.

Outside Staff Brought in/Specialists:

- Greater range of sports available for children to participate in.
- Collaboration with teachers to support them and help them develop so they are more confident and skilled.
- High quality learning and enjoyment.
- Children given the chance to develop skills further in sports they are interested in, in and out of school.
- Competitions and festivals allow children to interact and compete with local schools, encourages effective sportsmanship.
- Enable children to participate in sports they might not normally get the chance to.
- PE profile raised in PE and sport throughout the school.

Equipment

- Teachers are able to plan high quality lessons.
- Children can take part in a range of skills and sports.
- PE lessons are carried out safely, due to high quality, serviced PE equipment.
